The Conservancy Acquires 9.8 Acres

The Little Forks Conservancy has purchased this beautiful 9.8 acre property located along Big Salt Creek and the Chippewa River to hold as a preserve.

The Little Forks Conservancy is pleased to announce the purchase of 9.8 acres in Midland County. LFC purchased the property from Nancy Steiner for the bargain sale price of \$10,000. Ms. Steiner and her father, Richard Stroebel of Saginaw, sought out the Conservancy so this family property would forever remain "wild" and natural.

The property is nestled along the banks at the confluence of the Big Salt Creek and the Chippewa River, and provides almost one-half mile of water frontage. Covered with hemlocks, maple and oak, this forest is returning to the majestic woods of decades past. The forest floor is home to trout lilies, jack-in-the-pulpits and other native wildflowers. Birds also nest and rear their young on the site.
