LFC Holds Land Conservation Open House

September 25, 2006

The Little Forks Conservancy will hold a land conservation open house for landowners in the Cedar River watershed from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Tuesday, October 10, at the Hamilton Township Hall, 8996 E. Townline Lake Road, Harrison, Michigan. During the open house, the Conservancy will present information on its conservation easement purchase program.

The Little Forks Conservancy has received a grant from the State of Michigan to purchase conservation easements, an innovative conservation tool that protects land through the voluntary actions of individuals. This provides an opportunity for landowners to be paid for protecting the land within the Cedar River watershed.

The Cedar River watershed is located in north-central Michigan, crossing portions of Clare, Gladwin and Roscommon counties. Containing a section of blue ribbon trout stream, the Cedar River watershed provides important recreational uses in addition to high quality habitat for the area's aquatic resources.

The Little Forks Conservancy is a non-profit organization that helps private landowners develop lasting conservation solutions to protect the natural resources of their properties in the counties of the Tittabawassee River watershed.
